Directions from Sycamore Parking Lot:

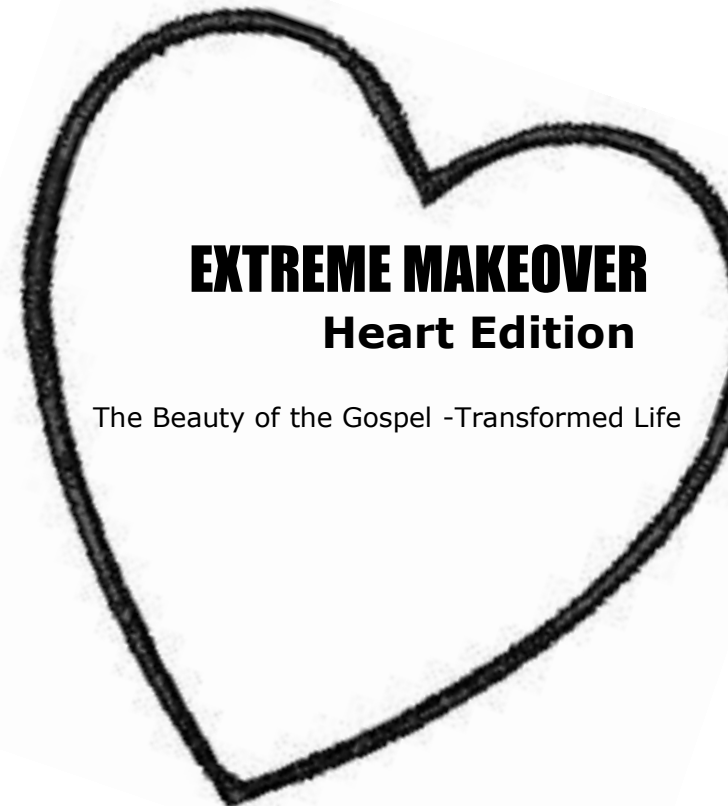
- Left on Coalfield Road, 0.7 mi.
